

CHEAC Legislative Hot Sheet 2002 - #2

May 17, 2002

SUPPORT 1

AB 849/Pavley - Requires school districts, participating in the free or reduced price meal program, to include a request form for Medi-Cal or Healthy Families Program information with an application for the meal program.

LAST ACTION: 7/5/01 passed out of Senate Health & Human Services

STATUS: Senate Appropriations Committee (Suspense File)

AB 2835/Longville – States the intent of the Legislature to permit a lien to be continued against any settlement, compromise, arbitration award, mediation settlement, or any other recovery obtained brought by an injured person for damages against a third party for a county that tries to recover medical treatment costs.

LAST ACTION: Passed out as amended of Assembly Judiciary 13-0

STATUS: Assembly Floor – Amended 5/16/02

SB 643/Ortiz - Requires the Board of Corrections to reimburse counties for excess costs of providing more effective psychotropic medications to county incarcerated inmates and parolees.

LAST ACTION: 7/10/01 passed out of Assembly Public Safety

STATUS: Assembly Appropriations Committee

SB 785/Ortiz - Increases parent eligibility for Healthy Families to 250% FPL and reduces family contribution requirements.

LAST ACTION: Amended in Assembly Appropriations 8/20/01 – Has not yet been heard

STATUS: Assembly Appropriations Committee

SB 1734/Vasconcellos – Provides that no public entity, its agents, or employees shall be subject to criminal prosecution for distribution of any device or substance necessary to ensure the safety and cleanliness of needles or syringes distributed to participants in clean needle and syringe exchange projects.

LAST ACTION: Passed out of Senate Health & Human Services 7-2

STATUS: Senate Floor

SB 1785/Vasconcellos – Deletes identity requirement for the purchase of hypodermic needles or syringes, and deletes the requirement that pharmacists keep detailed records of the nonprescription sale of such devices.

LAST ACTION: Passed out of Senate Appropriations (per Senate Rule 28.8)

STATUS: Senate Floor

SUPPORT 2

AB 41/Washington – Establishes in OCJP a program of financial and technical assistance for counties to provide DA's or County sheriffs with funds to coordinate multi-agency drug endangered child response teams.

LAST ACTION: Passed to Assembly for concurrence on 9/14/01

STATUS: Assembly Floor – Inactive File

AB 470/Wesson - Expands the Male Involvement Program to further reduce teenage pregnancy only if funds are appropriated.

LAST ACTION: Passed out of the Assembly on 6/5/01

STATUS: Senate Health and Human Services Committee

AB 1830/Frommer – Prohibits any person from distributing or selling tobacco via the U.S. Mail or any private mail service to minors. Requires specified distributors and sellers to verify that the purchaser is 18 or older, and to telephone the purchaser after 5pm to confirm the order prior to shipping.

LAST ACTION: Passed out of Assembly Government Organization as amended 16-6

STATUS: Assembly Appropriations – Set for hearing 5/22/02 – Amended 5/15/02

AB 1867/Vargas – Expands the prohibited areas for smoking and disposal to within 25 feet of a playground or tot lot sandbox area. Increases the fine for an infraction from \$100 to \$250.

LAST ACTION: Passed out of Assembly 43-24

STATUS: Senate Health & Human Services Committee

AB 1959/Corbett – Provides that a CalWORKS recipient who signs a welfare-to-work plan and who is continuously enrolled in a registered nurses training program be eligible for aid for a cumulative period of up to 48 months, in those counties that elect to provide aid pursuant to these provisions.

LAST ACTION: Passed out of Assembly 45-23

STATUS: Senate Health & Human Committee

AB 2010/Richman – Requires DHS to develop and implement a consolidated application form that would enable a clinic to elect to apply for licensure and a Medi-Cal identification number under a consolidated application procedure.

LAST ACTION: Passed out of Assembly Health 15-0

STATUS: Assembly Appropriations Committee – Set for hearing 5/22/02

AJR 31/Thomson – Memorializes Congress to provide funds to states and local governments for the provision of necessary security and relief measures to protect local citizens from terrorism.

LAST ACTION: Passed out of the Senate 38-0

STATUS: To Governor

SB 224/Speier – Expands the Breast Cancer Treatment Program from 200% to 250% FPL.

LAST ACTION: 7/10/01 Passed out of Assembly Health 16-0

STATUS: Assembly Appropriations Committee

SB 226/Chesbro - Extends operating authority and the sunset date for the County Medical Services Program from January 2003 to January 2008.

LAST ACTION: 6/12/01 Passed out of Assembly Health 16-0

STATUS: Assembly Appropriations Committee

SB 402/Ortiz - Requires DHS to any option available under federal law to relieve 19 and 20 year old Medi-Cal recipients from their share-of-cost obligation.

LAST ACTION: 6/4/01 Passed to the Assembly 25-13

STATUS: Assembly Health Committee

SB 599/Chesbro - Requires health plans to provide coverage for substance-use disorders on the same basis as they provide coverage for any other medical care.

LAST ACTION: 9/6/01 Passed out of Assembly Appropriations 14-6

STATUS: Assembly Floor – Inactive File

SB 616/Chesbro – Intent bill to create the Public Health Laboratory Training Program.

LAST ACTION: Passed to the Assembly 22-10

STATUS: Assembly

SB 1278/Speier – Indefinitely extends the provisions requiring pharmacies to charge Medicare beneficiaries a price not to exceed Medi-Cal reimbursement rates for prescription medicines. Requires

DHS to conduct an outreach program to inform Medicare beneficiaries.

LAST ACTION: Passed out of Senate Health & Human Services 10-0

STATUS: Senate Appropriations Committee – Suspense File

SB 1520/Ortiz – Prohibits the sale of carbonated beverages to pupils in elementary schools starting on 1/1/04, to pupils in middle or junior high schools on 1/1/05 and to pupils in high schools on 1/1/07.

LAST ACTION: Withdrawn from Senate Revenue & Taxation and re-referred to Senate Education

STATUS: Senate Education Committee – Set for Hearing 5/20/02 – Amended 4/29/02

SB 1695/Escutia – Requires EMSA to adopt regulations that provide for emergency medical technicians-I to be trained to administer naloxone hydrochloride to persons suffering drug overdoses.

LAST ACTION: Passed out of Senate Health & Human Services 10-0

STATUS: Senate Appropriations – Suspense File

SB 1890/Ortiz – Creates the Tobacco Use Reduction and Compensation Fund. Requires the funds collected to be used for tobacco use prevention and control, education and research, disease prevention, the provision of medical and preventative health services for low-income and uninsured individuals, and the expansion of medical insurance coverage for the uninsured.

LAST ACTION: Heard in Senate Revenue & Taxation on 4/10

STATUS: Senate Revenue & Taxation Committee

SB 2008/Speier – Establishes an Assumption Program of Loans for Nursing Education until 1/1/10. Any nursing applicant who agrees to provide at least 4 years of full-time service in a general acute care hospital, community clinic, free clinic, or Indian Health clinic or an acute psychiatric hospital would be eligible to enter into an agreement for loan assumption.

LAST ACTION: Passed out as amended of Senate Education 10-0

STATUS: Senate Appropriations Committee – Suspense File - Amended 5/8/02

OPPOSE 1

AB 2135/Ashburn – Eliminates HFP application assistance fees and deletes the provision allowing applicants to sign a statement as to the value or amount of their income.

STATUS: Assembly Health Committee – Failed Passage

AB 2700/Mountjoy – Limits the current motorcycle helmet law to drivers and passengers who are 20 years old or less. Provides that a person older than 21 may operate or ride as a passenger on a motorcycle without a helmet only if he or she has proof of at least \$1,000,000 in medical insurance on his or her person.

LAST ACTION: Heard in Assembly Rules – Referred to Assembly Floor

STATUS: Assembly Floor – Failed Passage 33-33 – Reconsideration granted – Amended 4/29/02

OPPOSE 2

SB 187/Vasconcellos - Establishes a statewide medical marijuana registration ID card program.

LAST ACTION: 9/14/01 Passed out of Assembly as amended 41-30

STATUS: Senate Floor for concurrence

SUPPORT IF AMENDED (SIA)

AB 2847/Florez – Provides that the Legislature encourages any entity that provides animal law enforcement services to provide its investigative employees with education in animal husbandry, handling and training of animals exhibited under the authority of a permit issued pursuant to a specified provision of state regulatory law.

LAST ACTION: Passed out of Assembly 60-1

STATUS: Senate Judiciary Committee

AB 2881/Chan – Requires the Superintendent of Public Instruction to convene a working group of

school nurses, teachers, administrators, School Health Connections office reps to develop core competency curriculum on identifying basic health issues that commonly affect pupil's school performance and to develop a related handbook for use by school districts.

LAST ACTION: Passed out of Assembly Education as amended 15-0

STATUS: Assembly Appropriations Committee – Suspense File – Amended 5/1/02

SUPPORT IN CONCEPT (SIC)

AB 32/Richman – Creates the Cal-Health Program to provide coordination of the Healthy Families Program and Medi-Cal.

LAST ACTION: Amended on 8/30/01, but not heard in Senate Appropriations

STATUS: Senate Appropriations Committee

BILLS OF INTEREST

AB 1763/Richman – Establishes a Public Health Emergency Powers Commission that would be required to submit to the Governor a designated public health emergency plan within 6 months after the commission's appointment. CHEAC is allowed one representative on the commission.

LAST ACTION: Passed out of Assembly Government Organization 21-0

STATUS: Assembly Appropriations Committee – Suspense File - Set for hearing 5/22/02

AB 1833/Nakano – Revises the claims payment procedures for county EMS funds. Makes various changes related to the administration of EMS funds.

LAST ACTION: Passed out of Assembly Health 15-0

STATUS: Assembly Appropriations Committee – Suspense File – Set for hearing 5/22/02
