Subject to the appropriation of future funds, expands the number of children eligible for HFP and Medi-Cal. Deletes the citizen and immigration requirements for children under HFP and Medi-Cal. Other provisions.	SIC
*AB 53/Dymally <i>HIV/AIDS</i>	<i>Location:</i> In Assembly Health Committee. <i>Last Amendment:</i> 3/27/07	Renames the Office of AIDS to the Office of HIV/AIDS Prevention and Education, and requires DPH to establish 6 regional HIV/AIDS centers.	Watch w/ Concerns
AB 110/Laird <i>Public Health</i>	<i>Location:</i> In Assembly Appropriations Committee on the suspense file.	Would allow counties to use HIV prevention and education funds to support clean needle and syringe projects.	S-2

Heard, no action taken. <i>Last Amendment:</i> 4/11/07	Directs the BOE to calculate the revenues that would be collected if an alcoholic beverage is reclassified as distilled spirit rather than a beer. Includes intent language to use those revenues to prevent underage drinking.	S-2

Reset for hearing 4/25/07. <i>Last Amendment:</i> 4/18/07	Establishes the Prevention of Youth Access to Alcoholic Beverages with Special Appeal to Minors Act of 2007. Requires beer manufacturers and wholesalers to submit info on their products to the ABC in order for the department to determine whether that product or brand has a special appeal to minors. Other provisions. Requires the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) to promulgate regs to require that any alcoholic beverage sold in CA to bear a label making its alcohol content easily discernable when the ABC determines the beverage meets specific criteria that may be appealing to minors. AB 423/Beall <i>Mental Health Alcohol/Drug</i>	<i>Location:</i> In Assembly Health Committee. <i>Hearing:</i> Set for hearing 4/24/07 . <i>Last Amendment:</i> 3/22/07	Expands coverage requirements for health plans and insurance, beginning 1/1/08, to include diagnosis and treatment of mental illness (current law only covers "severe mental illness") and substance abuse. AB 425/Adams <i>Public Health</i>	<i>Location:</i> In Assembly Transportation Committee. <i>Hearing:</i> Set for hearing 4/16/07 . Not heard.	Exempts motorcycle riders, over the age of 18, who have either completed a motorcycle rider training program or have been issued a class M1 license, from the helmet safety law.	O-1
AB 474/DeVore <i>VLF</i>	<i>Location:</i> In Assembly Transportation Committee. <i>Hearing:</i> Set for hearing 4/23/07 . <i>Last Amendment:</i> 4/16/07	Permits the Director of the DMV to establish a biennial vehicle registration period. Entitles a registrant choosing this option a 5% reduction in fees.	Watch w/ Concerns
AB 681/Carter <i>Health Departments</i>	<i>Location:</i> Referred to Assembly Local Government Committee and Assembly Health Committee.	Requires the San Bernardino County health department to establish a pilot program to prepare a local health assessment and planning report assessing the quality of health care provided to county residents. SB 48/Perata <i>Health Care Reform</i>	<i>Location:</i> In Senate Health Committee <i>Hearing:</i> Set for hearing <u>4/25/07</u> . <i>Last Amendment:</i> 4/18/07	Senator Perata's Health Care Reform proposal. Would expand health insurance coverage through employer/employee mandates and some public program expansions.	SIC
SB 137/Torlakson <i>CCS</i>	<i>Location:</i> In Senate Appropriations Committee on the Suspense File. <i>Last Amendment:</i> 3/21/07	Changes the eligibility limitation for CCS eligible families (currently at \$40,000) to a family with an annual or monthly income equal to or less than 400% FPL.	OUA
SB 147/Ashburn <i>Public Health</i>	<i>Location:</i> In Senate Appropriations Committee on the Suspense File.	Appropriates \$1 million to DHS to research the development of a vaccine for Valley Fever.	S-2

*SB 809/Ashburn <i>Clinics</i>	<i>Location:</i> In Senate Business, Professions and Economic Development Committee. <i>Last Amendment:</i> 3/26/07	Sets forth the activities that a nurse practitioner is authorized to engage in. Revises the educational requirements for certification as a nurse practitioner, and requires a nurse practitioner to be certified by a nationally recognized certifying body approved by the Board of Registered Nursing. Removes the mandatory supervision of a physician or surgeon requirement for nurse practitioners. Other provisions.	Watch w/ Concerns

SB 840/Kuehl <i>Health Care Reform</i>	<i>Location:</i> In Senate Appropriations Committee.	Establishes the California Health Insurance System to be administered by the newly created CA Health Insurance Agency under the control of an elected Health Insurance Commissioner. Makes all CA residents eligible for specified health care benefits under the system, which would, on a single-payer basis, negotiate for or set fees for health care services provided through the system and pay claims for those services. Requires the commissioner to seek all necessary waivers, exemptions, agreements or legislation to allow various existing federal, state and local health care payments to be paid to the system. Creates a health insurance policy board. Other provisions.	SIA

NOTE: Bills with an asterisk reflect CHEAC Legislative Committee action and positions are unofficial until ratified by the General Membership.

Definitions of Legislative Terms

Chaptered – A bill passed by the Legislature and signed into law by the Governor.

Concurrence – The approval by the house of origin of a bill that was amended in the opposite house .

Dead Bill – A bill that has not met legislative deadlines for passage. Usually occurs at the beginning of the second year of a two-year legislative session.

Failed Passage – A bill that has been voted on in either a committee or assembly or senate floor and did not receive a majority vote. An urgency measure or tax increase must receive 2/3 vote on the floor.

Gut and Amend – An amended bill where the previous legislative language is removed and replaced with entirely new subject matter.

Held in Committee – Status of a bill that is heard in committee but no action is taken.

Inactive File – A bill ready for floor consideration but placed on a dormant list upon the author’s request.

Interim Study – The assignment of a bill’s subject matter to the appropriate committee for study during the period the Legislature is not in session.

Reconsideration Granted – A motion giving the opportunity to take another vote on a bill that has failed passage in a committee hearing or floor session.

Rules Committee – All bills are initially referred to this committee in each house for policy committee assignments.

Spot Bill (or intent bill) – A bill that proposes nonsubstantive changes to a code section in a particular subject. Often used as a legislative vehicle later in the legislative session for ideas not fully fleshed out when the bill is introduced.

Suspense File – Bills meeting a certain appropriation threshold in fiscal committees are placed on the suspense file. Fiscal committees in each house hold a special hearing close to the fiscal committee deadlines (late May and August) to determine which bills will come off the suspense file and move forward. The decision on each bill is pre-determined by leadership and the committee vote is mostly a formality.
